



## Instek Digital secures Leeds City Centre

Leeds City Council voted to spend over 1.5 million pounds on an IP camera surveillance network. The city center has over 400 cameras and a network of around 300 cameras at its railway and bus stations to help monitor the public's safety 24 hours a day. The city council has credited the surveillance system with a drastic reduction of anti-social behavior. A councilor also told the story of a woman who was saved by the cameras: "A Leeds City Council CCTV operator also helped save a woman's life after she collapsed in January's heavy snow."



In addition to the cameras in the city center and located at bus stations and throughout the rail station, Leeds City has two mobile surveillance vans. The vans contain technology to compress video so that the images can be sent wirelessly to the surveillance control room. The vans can also be sent to football matches and special events where extra public security is needed.

All images can be viewed by a central control station outside the city center and special police cars equipped with remote software to view live video feeds.
